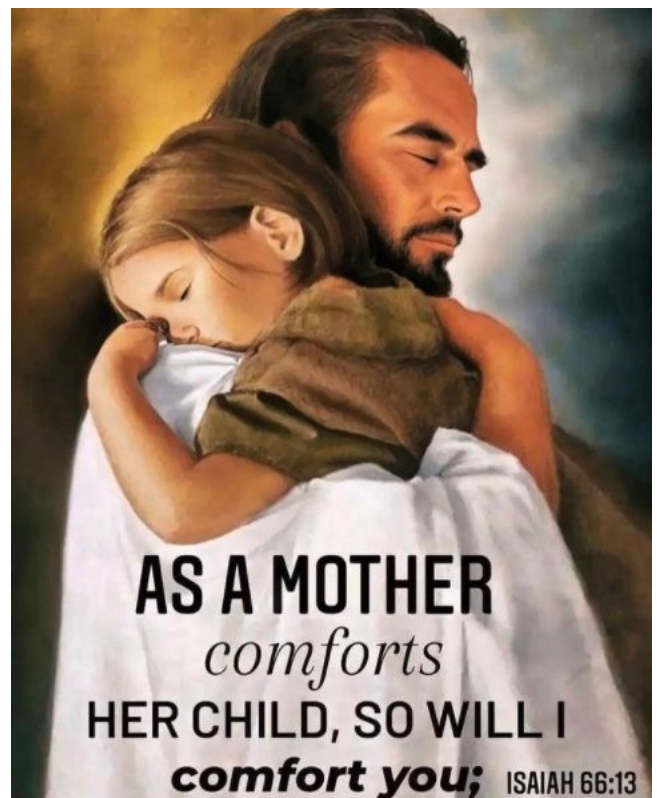
Mother—and more

Though I've primarily known God as Father—along with metaphors such as rock, eagle, shepherd, potter—I also learned of Scripture passages portraying God as mother. For example:

- "For a long time I have kept silent ... But now, like a woman in childbirth, I cry out, I gasp and pant" Isaiah 42:14 NIV
- "As a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you" Isaiah 66:13 NIV
- "Like a bear robbed of her cubs, I will attack them" Hosea 13:8 NIV
- In other words, God is pictured doing traditional "women's work": making clothes (Genesis 3:21 NIV), sweeping (Isaiah 14:23 NIV), preparing and hosting a meal (Proverbs 9:1-6 NIV), baking bread (Luke 13:21 NIV)

One of my favorite images of God is tucked in Hosea. While many modern dads nurture their toddlers this way, the tender words surely call to mind a mama's care: "It was I who taught [Israel] to walk...To them I was like one who lifts a little child to the cheek, and I bent down to feed them" (Hosea 11:3-4). Most importantly, God—however known—is loving and good.

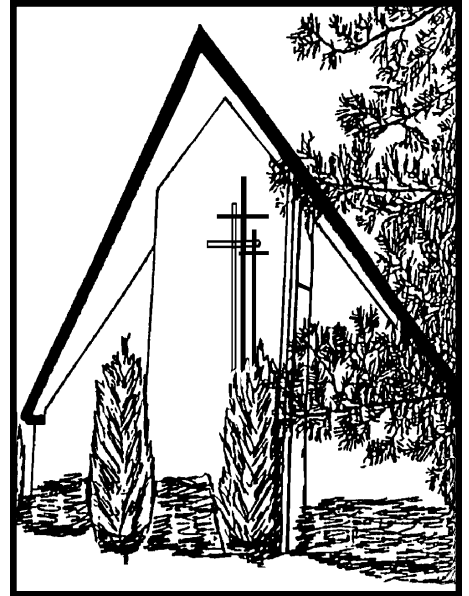

Follow Him in Generosity

Our Savior calls us to follow Him in generosity. "For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you" (John 13:15). We cannot give our lives for the salvation of the world, of course. Praise God, that job's already done! But with hearts full of thanksgiving for what Jesus has given us, we can follow His example of generous giving. And Jesus' generosity is not merely an example. Our Lord also commands us to act according to our gifts: "The one who contributes, [let him give] in generosity" (Romans 12:8).

So, when we bring offerings to the Lord, we should strive to heed His command and follow the pattern He has established for us. Jesus did not give us leftovers. He gave His best. We should not give leftovers, either, but the first and best of what He has given us. Jesus did not give as an afterthought—

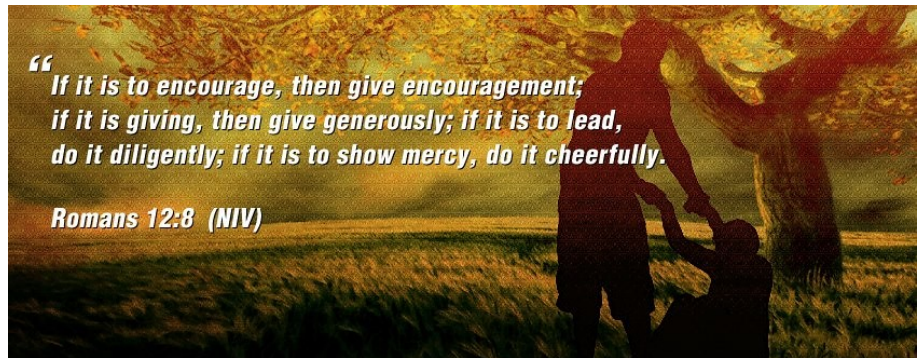
He gave according to the plan of salvation God established from the foundation of the world. So, when it comes to our own offerings, we should make a thoughtful plan to give generously, in proportion to the way He has blessed us. Like the Macedonian Christians, who gave according to their ability, and even beyond their ability (2 Corinthians 8:3), we should honor the Lord by giving a generous portion of the income that God provides us.

We should also give freely, just as Jesus gave freely for us. There is no compulsion involved in our works of love and our offerings to the Lord. We do not give grudgingly, but willingly and cheerfully, each "as he has decided in his heart," as the Lord says (2 Corinthians 9:7). There is no New Testament ceremonial law involved here. Rather, we are free to give as generously as our Savior has given for us!

In the same way, our Lord teaches us to give generously out of our love for Him and for our neighbor. Jesus shows us that genuine love is always love "in deed" (1 John 3:18). It is love that sees our neighbor in need and gives generously to help him. It is love that hears the Word of the Lord and does what it says. If we truly love, we give generously. If we give without love, our giving is not truly following Jesus.

Finally, we follow Jesus in generosity when we support His Gospel ministry and other works of mercy. The people of Israel gave generously to construct and support the operation of the tabernacle, for that was the place where the Lord received the Old Testament sacrifices, through which He bestowed the forgiveness of sins on His people. So, they gave abundantly, so abundantly they had to be told to stop giving! (Exodus 36:5-6). In the same way, we should bring generous offerings to support the Lord's work. We support our congregations in the preaching of His Word, Baptism and the Lord's Supper, which bestow His gifts of forgiveness, life and salvation, and we take care of those who are poor and needy.

Our Savior calls us to follow His example in generous giving. Let us then, with thankful hearts, rededicate ourselves to following Him in generosity.

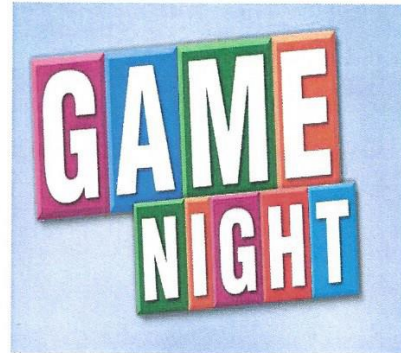

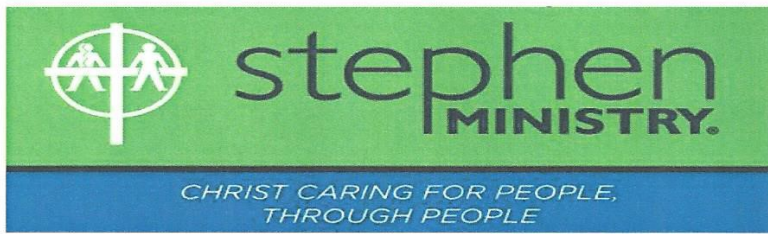

Stephen Ministry Frequently Asked Questions

Why is it called Stephen Ministry?

The name Stephen comes from the Bible in Acts 6 when the Apostles commissioned the first layperson to provide care to those in need. Founded in 1975, Stephen Ministry is a non-profit providing training and resources for biblical caregiving in churches and organizations worldwide. While the organization is based in St. Louis, Redeemer’s Stephen Ministry is one of thousands of ministries around the world practicing its model of care.

How can Stephen Ministry help me?

We all experience challenges in life — times when we could benefit from care and support. Stephen Ministers can provide the emotional and spiritual care you need when faced with a crisis or difficulty such as:

Can I get a Stephen Minister for someone I know? YES

The steps to refer someone to receive help from a Stephen Minister are:

1. Someone (*you, a relative, or friend*) who is hurting and in need of Christian care.
2. Always with the person’s permission, our Referrals Coordinator learns about this need for care from the person, a pastor, staff member, or a friend.
3. Our Referrals Coordinator meets with the person to talk about Stephen Ministry.
4. With the person’s permission, arrangements are made for a Stephen Minister to meet weekly with the person.
5. The Stephen Minister continues to provide Christ-centered, confidential care as needed.

A Stephen Minister is:

- A Christ-follower who walks beside a person who is hurting.
- Christian friend who cares, encourages, listens, prays, and supports.
- A carefully selected attendee who has completed 50 hours of training to provide distinctively biblical care
- Someone who faithfully meets weekly with his or her care receiver for as long as there’s a need

A Stephen Minister is not:

- A licensed counselor or therapist
- A problem-solver
- A casual visitor with a quick fix

Becoming a Stephen Minister:

**Do you believe God has gifted you to care for hurting people?
Then prayerfully consider becoming a Stephen Minister.**

A Stephen Minister is:

- A child of God who walks beside someone who is hurting.
- A member of the church body who is carefully selected to serve in this role because of his or her caregiving gifts.
- A person who has received 50 hours of training to provide high-quality, distinctively Christian care.
- A caring Christian friend who listens, cares, prays, supports and encourages.
- Someone who meets faithfully each week with his or her care receiver for as long as there is a need.

A Prayer for our Stephen Ministers and Care Receivers

Merciful God, You are good. You are our Great Physician, our Healer, and our Comforter.

We ask for your guidance and blessing on our Stephen Ministry. May this caregiving ministry touch the lives and hearts of people within and outside of our congregation. Help us to serve one another, reach out to those who are hurting, and care as you taught us.

Dear Lord, We pray for our Stephen Leaders, that they may be clothed with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. Guide their leadership, and be with them through the joys and challenges of their ministry.

Dear Lord, You called Stephen Ministers to bring your compassionate care to those who are burdened. We pray for our Stephen Ministers as they serve by listening, loving, caring, and supporting. Reveal to them your presence as they care and serve. Help them to rely on your promises and to turn back to you for strength.

Dear God, in the midst of everyday troubles we can sometimes lose sight of the promise of our salvation in you. There are those in our midst who carry heavy burdens. Help us to remember them in our prayers and lift them up to you. We pray that each of us, during difficult times in our lives, will recognize our need to receive care from others and be willing to accept your care through our brothers and sisters in Christ. Help us to encourage those who are especially burdened to turn to a pastor and/or our Stephen Leaders who can help them receive the one-on-one care they need.

And whatever we do, in word or in deed, we do it all in the name of Jesus, giving thanks to God our Father through him. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen

A Prayer to Keep a Grateful Heart By Lynette Kittle

“Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful” - Colossians 3:15

Having a grateful heart seems to be rare these days and at a premium to find. Social media is full and overflowing with discontented hearts - hearts that are angry, disappointed, hurt, grieving, and more. Still, God calls us to be thankful. So where and how do we gain gratefulness in such an ungrateful world?

Many individuals are living with an outlook of lack, seeing all the things they don't have because it's much easier to look at our glasses half-empty than half-full. Seeing our lives as lacking leads us to believe that if we only have more—more of the things we believe we need to be happy—our lives and our attitudes would be different. But it's not true. Grateful hearts don't come from owning things, holding positions, or having everyone love us. In an ever-changing world, there is no guarantee of hanging onto earthly possessions, especially in the shadow of natural disasters, wars, and more.

It's Up to Us to Choose

Whether we believe it or not, especially as Christians, it's up to us to choose to focus on what God has so graciously given us rather than what the world gives and takes away on a daily basis. Godly gratefulness is not dependent on what we own; yet, God has given us so much to be thankful for in life.

Colossians 3:17 encourages, “And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him.”

Even if we have nothing to our names, we have incredibly valid reasons to thank Him daily. Things, positions, locations, and more don't bring happiness; rather, true gratitude comes from deep within us.

Gratefulness as a Sacrifice

Sadly, life sometimes brings tragic losses of loved ones, homes, jobs, and more, but still God calls us to be thankful. He knows our weaknesses and understands how it can be difficult for us to do so when we're disappointed, discouraged, suffering, or grieving. Although 1 Thessalonians 5:18 instructs us to “Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus,” it doesn't mean we thank God for the sad situations, but thank Him in the midst of them.

Some believers are confused by this verse, thinking God expects us to thank Him for the sad and tragic situations and losses that bring us disappointment, discouragement, suffering, and grief. But He's not. God's given us so many spiritual blessings, not dependent on our circumstances, that we can praise Him and give Him thanks no matter our situation. He is compassionate and recognizes this kind of gratitude as a sweet sacrifice to Him. Psalm 116:17 encourages our sacrificial thankfulness. “I will sacrifice a thank offering to You and call on the name of the Lord.”

When we do, God responds, as recorded in Psalm 50:23. “Those who sacrifice thank offerings honor Me, and to the blameless I will show My salvation.” In uncertain times, God calls us to focus on Him and His faithfulness instead of our situations, to remind ourselves of His promise to never leave or forsake us (Hebrews 13:5) and to trust Him to help us through everything we face in life.

Let's pray:

Dear Father,

Thank you for all Your spiritual blessings You so lovingly and graciously bestow upon me. As Ephesians 1:3 states, “Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ.” Strengthen and encourage me, Lord, to be thankful each and every day of my life for all You have given to me. Help me to focus on all Your benefits. Lead me to live a life of sincere gratitude to You. Keep my heart softened and set on seeking You. Teach me through Your Holy Spirit to walk and live each and every day of the year, with a grateful heart, not dependent on my situation and circumstances but based on who You are and what You've given Me through Jesus Christ, my Savior. ***In Jesus' name, Amen***

a fun Flower Frog

A flower frog sits atop a vase to help arrange flowers and hold stems in place. This personalized frog will become a favorite!

What you need:

- Air-dry clay
- Roller
- Vase (or jar)
- Plastic knife
- Straw
- Acrylic paint and brushes



What you do:

1. Roll out a portion of clay to about ½-inch thickness.
2. Cut out a circle that's slightly larger than the vase opening. (This will allow the finished frog to sit securely on top.)
3. To make holes for stems, use a straw to punch out circle shapes. If you make more than one frog, try arranging the holes in different patterns.
4. Let dry completely. Then personalize your work with acrylic paint.
5. When dry, place the frog atop the vase. Arrange flowers and greenery to make a Mother's Day bouquet.

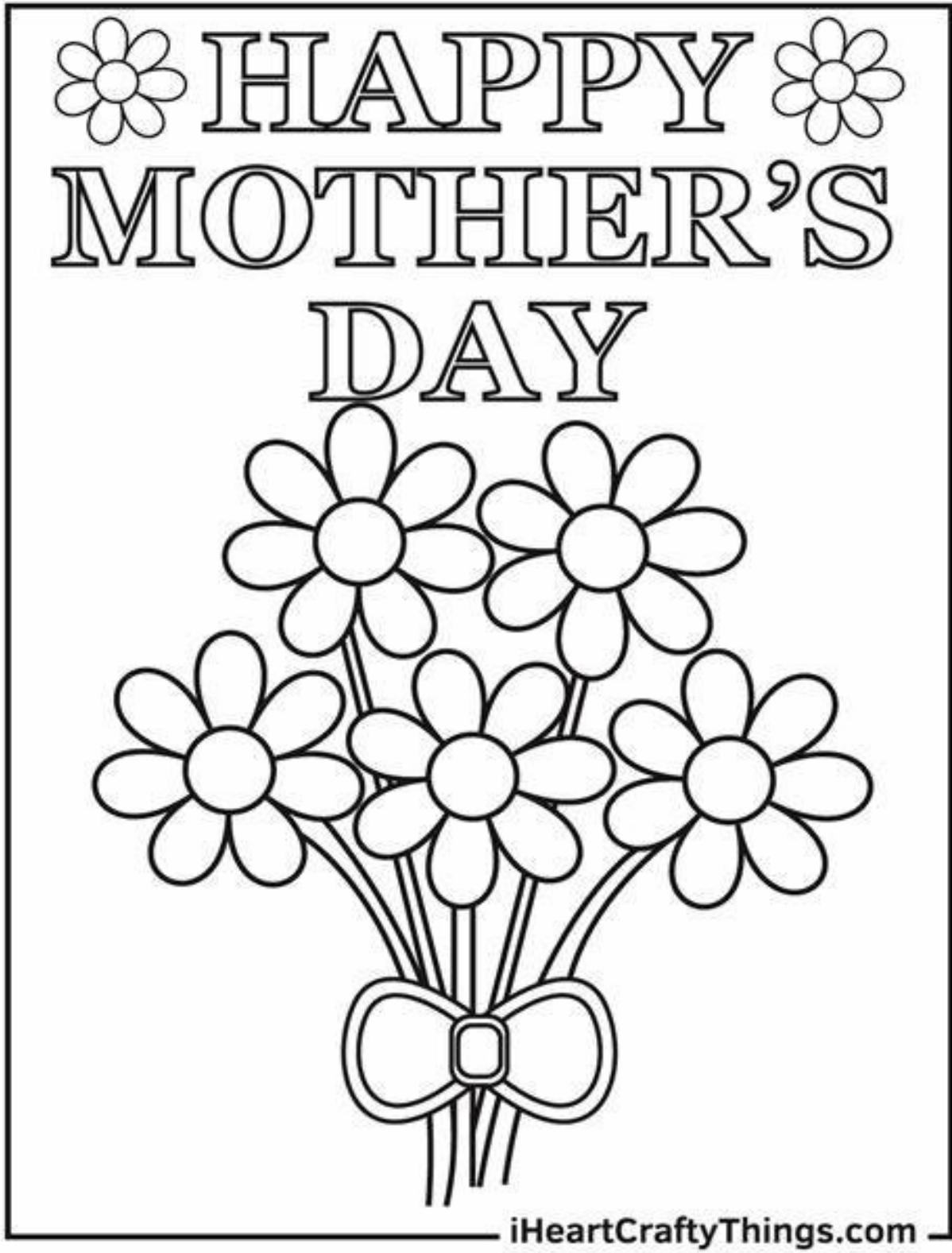

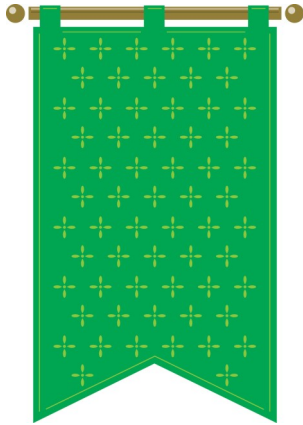

GREEN — Green is the traditional liturgical color for the weeks after Pentecost (as well as the season of Epiphany). The Pentecost season largely overlaps with spring and summer, which is fitting because green symbolizes growth: growth of plant life and crops, and growth of the church in discipleship and faith.
